

Notice of

King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi:

The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak

No. 14 on April 11, 2021

On April 11, 2021, the University was reported that an undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering tested positive for COVID-19 **(the seventh case of KMUTT)**. The timeline of the said student before being infected until now is as follows:

The student stayed at the Cube Condo located on the Pracha Uthit road, Thung Khru District.

According to the reported timeline, the student was in close contact with 2 other students on March 30, 2021 as they conducted a group project together. However, it is suspected that the said period is before this student was infected by COVID-19.

April 1, 2021

At 15.00 – 18.00 hrs. – Went to Future Park Rangsit using private vehicle and had meal at Sushi Express restaurant (Future Park Rangsit branch)

18.00 – 19.00 hrs. – Returned to his house in Pathum Thani Province.

April 2, 2021 – Went to the entertainment venue(s) at Kaset-Nawamin Road where **it is suspected that COVID-19 infected person(s) from the Thong Lor cluster visited.**

From March 30 to April 11, 2021, the student did not access the University area (Bangmod Campus).

The University has given order that all related units shall investigate and identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with such as classmates and students whom the infected student did activities with. Even if being considered as a Low-Risk Close Contacts, those people must undergo self-quarantine to monitor their symptoms for at least 14 days. The Department/Office shall submit the name list to the Welfare and Coordination Unit of the COVID-19 Emergency Operation and Assistance Center of King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi (KMUTT COVID-19 Center). The self-quarantine will not be considered as absence from class or work and will not be counted as leave days. Should any symptoms of illness such as fever, dry cough, sore throat, runny nose, shortness of breath have developed, please urgently contact the Welfare and Coordination Unit of KMUTT COVID-19 Center.

The University strictly followed the procedures of COVID-19 surveillance measures as announced in the Announcement of the COVID-19 Emergency Operation Assistance Center No.1/2021 after the Covid 19 case was reported.

In case that students or staff have done a self-assessment at <http://bkkcovid19.bangkok.go.th/covid/frontend/web/>, and may be considered high-risk of being exposed to COVID-19, please contact your faculty or office and undergo self-quarantine for 14 days to monitor your symptoms. Should any symptoms of illness have developed, please urgently contact the Health Department of Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) or your nearest hospital(s), then report to the Welfare and Coordination Unit of KMUTT COVID-19 Center via 24-hours hotline number at 02 4709090 or email at qanda@mail.kmutt.ac.th.

The University is highly concerned about the current situation and urges all students and staff to strictly comply with the preventive measures and avoid going to risk areas, crowded places such as markets.
