

Notice of

King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi:

The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak

No. 66 on July 21, 2021

On July 21, 2021, the University was reported 6 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a Grade 11 student of the SCiU Program, Darunsikkhalai School for Innovative Learning (DSIL) **(the 101st case of KMUTT)**. Currently, the student is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The student had neither visited DSIL nor KMUTT (Bang Khun Thian Campus), and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a female undergraduate student from the Joint Management Program, Media Arts and Media Technology, School of Architecture and Design **(the 102nd case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hadn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus and KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus) and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a female undergraduate student from the Joint Management Program, Media Arts and Media Technology, School of Architecture and Design **(the 103rd case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hadn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus and KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus) and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Production Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 104th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The student hadn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hadn't done any activities with other students and staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a female staff member of the Office of the President **(the 105th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in a hospital for treatment. The staff reported that she entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on the following dates: July 9, July 12, and July 14, 2021. She kept physical distancing with the others and wore a face mask all the time. The investigation revealed 5 staff members who are considered as a risk group. The University has given order the 5 staff members to undergo self-quarantine and work from home for 14 days.

The sixth case is a male staff member of the Office of Building and Ground Management **(the 106th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in a hospital for treatment. The staff reported that he entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on July 9, 2021. He kept physical distancing with the others and wore a face mask all the time. The investigation revealed 1 staff member who are considered as a low-risk group. The University has given order the said staff member to undergo self-quarantine and work from home for 14 days.
