King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi:

The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak

No. 72 on July 27, 2021

On July 27, 2021, the University was reported 10 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follow

The first case is a female staff member of the Office of the President **(the 141st case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program). The staff reported that 14 days before knowing the positive result of COVID-19 test she had worked at home. Moreover, she had neither entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) nor done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Computer Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 142nd case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 143rd case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in the care of a Public Health Service Centers, Bangkok Metropolitan Administration and is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program). The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Production Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 144th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT

Bangmod Campus) only on June 29, 2021 in the afternoon. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 145th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a female undergraduate student from the School of Information Technology **(the 146th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventh case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Microbiology, Faculty of Science **(the 147th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in a government hospital for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 15, 2021 in the afternoon. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eighth case is a male undergraduate student of the Interior Architecture Program, School of Architecture and Design **(the 148th case of KMUTT)**. He was in a government hospital for treatment from July 11- July 23, 2021. Currently, he is undergoing the Home Isolation Program

as he doesn't have any symptom. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The ninth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Educational Communications and Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 149th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in a government hospital for treatment. The student visited the Department of Educational Communications and Technology, CB3 Building on June 29, 2021. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The tenth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Educational Communications and Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 150th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is undergoing Home Isolation Program. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.
