

Notice of

King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi:

The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak

No. 68 on July 23, 2021

On July 23, 2021, the University was reported 6 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a female master's student from the Thermal Technology Program, School of Energy, Environment, and Materials **(the 111th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on July 2, 2021. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she had neither visited KMUTT Bangmod Campus nor done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a male student of the KOSEN Program, Darunsikkhalai School for Innovative Learning (DSIL) **(the 112th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't visited KMUTT (Bang Khun Thian Campus), and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Production Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 113th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a male master's student from the Graduate School of Management and Innovation (**the 114th case of KMUTT**). Currently, he is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a female staff member of the Darunsikkhalai School for Innovative Learning (DSIL) (**the 115th case of KMUTT**). Currently, she is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The staff entered the School premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on the following dates: July 7 and July 9, 2021. She kept physical distancing and wore a face mask all the time. While visiting DSIL on the mentioned dates, she hadn't been in close contact with other students or staff and hadn't done activities with them.

The seventh case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Tool and Materials Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (**the 116th case of KMUTT**). Currently, she is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.
