

Notice of King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi: The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak No. 71 on July 26, 2021

On July 26, 2021, the University was reported 6 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follow:

The first case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 135th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Microbiology, Faculty of Science **(the 136th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 19, 2021 to store her belongings at the microbiology laboratory (Lab MI501). She stayed at the Lab MI501 around 20 minutes and didn't meet with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a male master's student from the Department of Microbiology, Faculty of Science **(the 137th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in a government hospital for treatment. The student visited KMUTT Bangmod Campus on June 21, 2021 in the afternoon and July 10, 2021 to conduct his research project with his classmates. The student reported that he wore a face mask all the time, wasn't in close contact, and didn't have any meals with his friends. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Production Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 138th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 30, 2021 in the morning. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Educational Communications and Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 139th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in the care of a private hospital and is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program). The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only 1 day in the middle of June. Except for that day, she had neither visited the University nor done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Mathematics, Faculty of Science **(the 140th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.
