## King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi:

### The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak

#### No. 91 on August 15, 2021

On August 15, 2021, the University was reported 10 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Educational Communications and Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 300<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a male student from Industrial Technology Program, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 301<sup>st</sup> case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 28, 2021. He wore a facemask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 302<sup>nd</sup> case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 15, 2021. She wore a facemask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a female undergraduate student from the Joint Management Program, Media Arts and Media Technology, School of Architecture and Design **(the 303<sup>rd</sup> case of KMUTT)**. The student reported that she has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment in the government hospital. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 28, 2021. She wore a facemask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she had neither visited KMUTT Bangmod Campus nor KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus, and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a male master's student from the School of Information Technology **(the 304<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Electrical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 305<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students and staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventh case is a female staff member of the Department of Electrical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 306<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The staff reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students and staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eighth case is a male staff from a facility maintenance company who works at KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus **(the 307<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in a private hospital for treatment. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The ninth case is a male staff from a facility maintenance company who works at KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus **(the 308<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in a private hospital for treatment. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The tenth case is a female staff member of the Office of the Dean, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 309<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT)**. She has fully recovered from COVID-19 after receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program). The staff reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students and staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.
