## King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi: The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak No. 76 on July 31, 2021

On July 31, 2021, the University was reported 8 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follow

The first case is a male undergraduate student from the Applied Computer Science-Multimedia Program, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 170<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). The student has already registered for Home Isolation Program, and is currently waiting for further response from the government agencies. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Chemical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 171<sup>st</sup> case of KMUTT). After being diagnosed with COVID-19 by the government hospital, she is currently waiting to be transferred for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Tool and Materials Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 172<sup>nd</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) and is in the care of a private hospital. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a female undergraduate student from the Applied Computer Science-Multimedia Program, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 173<sup>rd</sup> case of KMUTT). The student had received a treatment in the government hospital, and is currently undergoing self-quarantine to monitor her symptoms at the Hospital Isolation Center. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only 1 day in late June. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a female undergraduate student from the Digital Service Innovation Program, School of Information Technology (the 174<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of a government agency. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 30, 2021 in the afternoon. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Environmental Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 175<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of a private hospital. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventh case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Printing and Packaging Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 176<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). After being diagnosed with COVID-19 by the government hospital, she is currently waiting to be transferred for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 21, 2021 in the morning. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eighth case is a female staff member of the Pilot Plant Development and Training Institute, KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus (the 177<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of a government agency. The said staff reported that she visited KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus on July 6, 2021 in the morning. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.
