King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi: The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak No. 75 on July 30, 2021

On July 30, 2021, the University was reported 7 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follow

The first case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 163rd case of KMUTT). Currently, she is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of the government agency. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a male PhD student from the Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 164th case of KMUTT). The student has already registered for Home Isolation Program, and is currently waiting for further response from the government agencies. The student visited KMUTT Bangmod Campus only on June 14, 2021 in the afternoon. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a male master's student from the Department of Environmental Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 165th case of KMUTT). The student has already registered for Home Isolation Program, and is currently waiting for further response from the government agencies. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a male master's student from the School of Energy, Environment and Materials (the 166th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a female master's student from the School of Energy, Environment and Materials (the 167th case of KMUTT). After being diagnosed with COVID-19 by the private hospital, she is currently waiting to be transferred for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Mathematics, Faculty of Science (the 168th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of the government agency. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventh case is a male master's student from the Department of Chemical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 169th case of KMUTT). The student has already registered for Home Isolation Program, and is currently waiting for further response from the government agencies. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 15, 2021 in the afternoon. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.
