King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi:

The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak

No. 81 on August 5, 2021

On August 4, 2021, the University was reported 14 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 208th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Electronic and Telecommunication Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 209th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of a medical clinic. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Electrical Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 210th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Tool and Materials Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 211th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a female undergraduate student from the Applied Computer Science–Multimedia Program, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 212th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Printing and Packaging Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 213th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of a medical clinic. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 29, 2021. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventh case is a male undergraduate student from the Applied Computer Science–Multimedia Program, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 214th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of a government hospital. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 30, 2021. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eighth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Civil Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 215th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is waiting to be transferred to a government hospital for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 21, 2021. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The ninth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Microbiology, Faculty of Science **(the 216th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is in a government hospital for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 29, 2021. He wore a facemask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The tenth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Printing and Packaging Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology **(the 217th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of a government hospital. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 30, 2021. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eleventh case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Chemical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 218th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The twelfth case is a male undergraduate student from the Information Technology Program, School of Information Technology (the 219th case of KMUTT). He has already contacted the relevant government agencies, and is currently waiting for further response regarding his treatment program. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The thirteenth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Chemical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 220th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in a government hospital for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 29, 2021. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourteenth case is a male security guard of KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus **(the 221st case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of a private hospital. The investigation revealed 3 people who are considered as a risk group. They are currently undergoing self-quarantine at home for 14 days to monitor their symptoms.
