## King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi: The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak No. 84 on August 8, 2021

On August 8, 2021, the University was reported 6 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a female staff member of the Office of Building and Ground Management (the 241<sup>st</sup> case of KMUTT). She has already contacted the relevant government agencies, and is currently waiting for further response regarding her treatment program. The staff reported that she entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on July 27, 2021. She wore a face mask all the time and keep distancing with other staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a female undergraduate student from the Joint Management Program, Media Arts and Media Technology, School of Architecture and Design (the 242<sup>nd</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 14, 2021. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 243<sup>rd</sup> case of KMUTT). The student reported that he has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment in the government hospital. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 14, 2021. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a male staff member of the Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 244<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a government hospital for treatment. The staff reported that he entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on July 9, 2021. The investigation revealed no staff member or student who is considered as a risk group.

The fifth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Tool and Materials Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 245<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a male security guard working in the Institute of Field Robotics Building. (the 246<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) under the care of a government hospital. The last day that he was at work is July 30, 2021. He wore a face mask all the time and kept physical distancing with other staff. The investigation revealed 1 staff member who is considered as a risk group. The said staff currently undergoing self-quarantine at home for 14 days to monitor the symptoms.
