

## **Notice of** King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi: The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak No. 88 on August 12, 2021

On August 12, 2021, the University was reported 10 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Printing and Packaging Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 275<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). The student reported that she has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment in the government hospital. Currently, she is undergoing 14-day self-quarantine. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a female undergraduate student from the Information Technology Program, School of Information Technology (the 276<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program), and is waiting for further response from the private hospital regarding her treatment program. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Control System and Instrumentation Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 277<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program). The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 28, 2021. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control. The fourth case is a female undergraduate student from the Applied Computer Science-Multimedia Program, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 278<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program), and is waiting for further response from the private hospital regarding her treatment program. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a male undergraduate student from the Applied Computer Science-Multimedia Program, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 279<sup>th</sup> case of **KMUTT**). Currently, he is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program). The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Educational Communications and Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 280<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a government hospital for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 28, 2021. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventh case is a staff from a facility maintenance company who works at KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus **(the 281<sup>st</sup> case of KMUTT)**. Currently, the staff is in a private hospital for treatment. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eighth case is a staff from a facility maintenance company who works at KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus (the 282<sup>nd</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, the staff is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The ninth case a staff from a facility maintenance company who works at KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus (the 283<sup>rd</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, the staff is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The tenth case is a staff from a facility maintenance company who works at KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus (the 284<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, the staff is in the care of the relevant government agencies and is waiting to be transferred to hospital for treatment.
