

Notice of King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi: The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak No. 89 on August 13, 2021

On August 13, 2021, the University was reported 7 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a male staff member of the Computer Center **(the 285th case of KMUTT)**. He has already contacted the hospital, and is currently waiting for further response regarding his treatment program. The staff entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 21, 2021. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a female cleaning staff who works in the Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering Building **(the 286th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is in a hospital for treatment. The staff reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a post-doctoral researcher from the Department of Food Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 287th case of KMUTT). Currently, the researcher is in a private hospital for treatment. During the visit to the University (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on June 14, 2021, the researcher wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, the researcher hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected researcher might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Mathematics, Faculty of Science **(the 288th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, she is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 29, 2021. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Educational Communications and Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 289th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is receiving medical treatment at home (Home Isolation Program) while waiting for further response from the private hospital regarding his treatment program. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Electronic and Telecommunication Engineering, Faculty of Engineering **(the 290th case of KMUTT)**. Currently, he is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 30, 2021. He wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, he hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventh case is a male staff member of the School of Architecture and Design (the 291st case of KMUTT). The staff has already registered for Home Isolation Program, and is currently waiting for further response from the government agencies. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.
