King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi: The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak No. 94 on August 18, 2021

On August 18, 2021, the University was reported 7 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Mathematics, Faculty of Science (the 320th case of KMUTT). She is currently waiting to be transferred to the government hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a female master's student from the Graduate School of Management and Innovation (the 321st case of KMUTT). The student reported that she has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment in the government hospital. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 28, 2021. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a female master's student from the Department of Printing and Packaging Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 322nd case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) only on June 28, 2021. She wore a face mask all the time and wasn't in close contact with other students or staff. Except for that day, she hadn't visited the University and hadn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a male master's student from the Department of Control System and Instrumentation Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 323rd case of KMUTT). The student reported that he has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since June. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Mathematics, Faculty of Science (the 324th case of KMUTT). The student reported that he has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment in the government hospital. The seventh case is a female staff member of the Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 326th case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The staff reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students and staff. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected staff might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.
