King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi: The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak No. 191 on January 20, 2022

On January 20, 2022, the University was reported 18 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Electrical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 606th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students and staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a male undergraduate student from the Institute of Field Robotics (the 649th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students and staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 650th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a male undergraduate student from the Institute of Field Robotics (the 651st case of KMUTT). Currently, he is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students and staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 652nd case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Electrical Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 653rd case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventh case is a male undergraduate student from the Institute of Field Robotics (the 654th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students and staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eighth case is a female undergraduate student from the Institute of Field Robotics (the 655th case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students and staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The ninth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Microbiology, Faculty of Science (the 656th case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on these following dates: January 12, 2022 to receive COVID-19 vaccine, January 14-15, 2022 to film video and January 18, 2022 to have meal at Dhammaraksa Residence Hall (KMUTT female residence). The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The tenth case is a male master's student from the Faculty of Engineering (the 657th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a private hospital for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on January 13, 2022 to conduct his research project at the laboratory of the Classroom Building 5, floor 5th and to have meal with his friends. His at-risk friends are informed to undergo self-quarantine to monitor their symptoms for 14 days. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eleventh case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 658th case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The twelfth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 659th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The thirteenth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 660th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourteenth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Tool and Materials Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 661st case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifteenth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Computer Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 662nd case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on January 10, 2022. He kept physical distancing and wore a face mask all the time while visiting the university premises. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixteenth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Tool and Materials Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 663rd case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventeenth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Tool and Materials Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 664th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The student also reported that he had met his friends to have meal and had travelled together. His at-risk friends are informed to undergo self-quarantine to monitor their symptoms for 14 days. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eighteenth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 665th case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on January 11, 2022. She kept physical distancing and wore a face mask all the time while visiting the university premises. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.
