

## **Notice of** King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi: The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak No. 192 on January 21, 2022

On January 21, 2022, the University was reported 24 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Printing and Packaging Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 666<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on January 10, 2022. He kept physical distancing and wore a face mask all the time while visiting the university premises. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Mechanical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 667<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The student also reported that he had met his friends to have meal and had travelled together. His at-risk friends are informed to undergo self-quarantine to monitor their symptoms for 14 days. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a male undergraduate student from the Digital Service Innovation Program, School of Information Technology (the 668<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The student also reported that he had met his friends to have meal and had travelled together. His at-risk friends are informed to undergo self-quarantine to monitor their symptoms for 14 days. The student also reported that he had met his friends to have meal and had travelled together. His at-risk friends are informed to undergo self-quarantine to monitor their symptoms for 14 days. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The twelfth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Chemistry, Faculty of Science (the 677<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on January 18, 2022 in the morning to conduct her research project at the laboratory of the Fundamental Science Laboratory Building on the 7th and 5th floor. Her at-risk classmates are informed to undergo self-quarantine to monitor their symptoms for 14 days. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The thirteenth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Electronic and Telecommunication Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 678<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The student also reported that he had met his friends to have meal and had travelled together. His at-risk friends are informed to undergo self-quarantine to monitor their symptoms for 14 days. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourteenth case is a female undergraduate student from the Joint Management Program, Media Arts and Media Technology, School of Architecture and Design (the 679<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus and KMUTT Bang Khun Thian Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifteenth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Electronic and Telecommunication Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 680<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a private hospital for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) and hasn't done any activities with other students or staff since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixteenth case is a female undergraduate student from the Information Technology Program, School of Information Technology (the 681<sup>st</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a private hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventeenth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Electrical Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 682<sup>nd</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. Currently, she is in a private hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus and KMUTT Bang Khun Thain Campus) since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The twentieth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Chemical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 685<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a private hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The twenty-second case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Civil Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 687<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on January 10, 2022. He kept physical distancing and wore a face mask all the time while visiting the university premises. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The twenty-third case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Chemical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 688<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since Januaty 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The twenty-fourth case is a male master's student from the School of Energy, Environment, and Materials (the 689<sup>th</sup> case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since December. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.
