King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi: The surveillance of COVID-19 outbreak No. 200 on January 29, 2022

On January 29, 2022, the University was reported 12 COVID-19 confirmed cases as follows:

The first case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Electrical Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 770th case of KMUTT). The student reported that he has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment in a hospitel. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The second case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Control System and Instrumentation Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 771st case of KMUTT). The student reported that he has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment in a government hospital. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The third case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Chemical Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 772nd case of KMUTT). The student reported that she has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment in a private hospital. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fourth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Electrical Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 773rd case of KMUTT). The student reported that he has fully recovered from COVID-19 after undergoing Home Isolation Program. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The fifth case is a male undergraduate student from the Computer Science Program, School of Information Technology (the 774th case of KMUTT). The student reported that he has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment in a private hospital. The student reported that he hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The sixth case is a male undergraduate student from the Information Technology Program, School of Information Technology (the 775th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is undergoing the Home Isolation Program. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on January 7, 2022. He kept physical distancing and wore a face mask all the time while visiting the university premises. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The seventh case is a female master's student from the School of Information Technology (the 776th case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a private hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eighth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Educational Communications and Technology, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 777th case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a government hospital for treatment. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The ninth case is a female undergraduate student from the Department of Electrical Technology Education, Faculty of Industrial Education and Technology (the 778th case of KMUTT). The student reported that she has fully recovered from COVID-19 after being hospitalized for treatment in a hospitel. The student reported that she hasn't entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) since January 2022. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The tenth case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Electronic and Telecommunication Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 779th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on January 10, 2022. He kept physical distancing and wore a face mask all the time while visiting the university premises. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The eleventh case is a male undergraduate student from the Department of Electronic and Telecommunication Engineering, Faculty of Engineering (the 780th case of KMUTT). Currently, he is in a hospitel for treatment. The student entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on January 10, 2022. He kept physical distancing and wore a face mask all the time while visiting the university premises. The related units are currently investigating to identify people whom the infected student might be in close contact with to assess the level of risk and continue to operate the relevant practices according to the measures of the Department of Disease Control.

The twelfth case is a female staff member of the Graduate School of Management and Innovation (the 781st case of KMUTT). Currently, she is in a hospital for treatment. The staff reported that she entered the University premises (KMUTT Bangmod Campus) on January 24, 2022. She kept physical distancing with the others and wore a face mask all the time. According to the investigation, there were other staff members working in the room with the infected staff on that day. Thus, the University has ordered the staff members who were considered the risk group to work at their residence and conduct the ATK tests; currently, all of them test negative (COVID-19 not detected).
